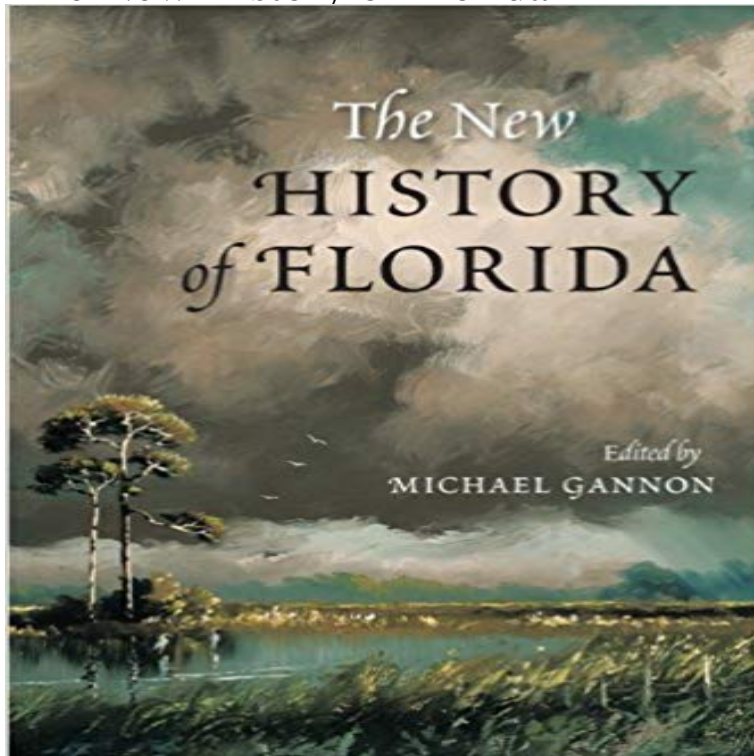


The New History of Florida

The first state flag was raised over a new capitol in Tallahassee on May 26, 1845.
